REVIEW

2019 Season Recap

When the NSW Swifts first met ahead of the 2019 Suncorp Super Netball competition, Head Coach Briony Akle had a simple message: prove them all wrong. There were glimpses of what was to come when they contested the pre-season #TeamGirls Cup in Brisbane in March. Three solid wins against the Giants, Adelaide Thunderbirds and Queensland Firebirds was a good return for a group expected by most to be lion-hearted, but ultimately out of the equation come Super Netball Finals time.

Then Round 1 happened. The neighbours, the Giants, were expected to cut these Swifts down to size. They didn't. Neither did the new-look Thunderbirds or 2018 runners-up West Coast Fever. A stumble on the home-stretch at home against the defending champion Sunshine Coast Lightning in Round 4 would have been enough to derail a lesser group, but these young Swifts were more than smiles and skill. Before long they'd sent the Melbourne Vixens and Collingwood Magpies packing, and when a cruel blow robbed them of captain Maddy Proud in Brisbane, they steered themselves home to secure a first competitive away win over Firebirds in almost a decade. Perhaps 2019 was going to be a little different.

Proud wouldn't be the first to fall. Both attackers and defenders would be lost in the battle too. In fact the Swifts lost three of their rostered 10 players to season-ending injuries, and others for lengthy periods. Despite this, the injured remained an inspiration for a group that knew their place at the top of the table was more than luck. It was validation. Up stepped club stalwart Paige Hadley and a host of others. Sarah Klau, like Hadley, would do enough to on court for the Swifts to gain World Cup selection for the

Australian Diamonds. Helen Housby showed just why she's a Commonwealth gold medallist, and Sam Wallace – in typically flamboyant fashion – shot the lights out. No longer would the Swifts, the most decorated club in Australian netball, be lost in the wilderness. Eleven years was far too long to wait for another Premiership. The players, the coaches, the support staff, the club staff all began to row in unison.

The World Cup came and went, and the Swifts played a huge role. Despite the travails of travel, injury and huge mental pressure NSW returned to the playoffs for the first time since 2016, surviving trips out West and down South in the process.

Their top-two regular season finish earned them two bites to secure the cherry of a Grand Final, but still no pundits were backing them. When the Lightning won the Major Semi Final by 10 to secure a home decider, the Swifts were expected to be cannon-fodder for the Vixens in the Prelim Final in Sydney. But then the belief came back. With everything against them, the Vixens juggernaut was emphatically halted. The Swifts were back in the big dance.

Again the pundits expected the Lightning to secure a three-peat. Most people had the Premiers winning by 10. It didn't bother Akle's troops, it was simply status quo. But what didn't surprise Akle was the Grand Final performance. A 17-goal win, and a 27-goal turnaround against the Lightning since the last time they played.

"I told these players they were good enough," she said afterwards. "All they had to do was believe. Now I want them to push on and do this again, and again."

A sixth title in the trophy cabinet. These Swifts kids were pretty good after all.

Round 1 Recap

The Swifts started their 2020 SSN title defence with a thrilling 63-61 win over local rivals the Giants at Nissan Arena in Brisbane on Sunday. It was a game that ebbed and flowed from start to finish.

“Both sides put in a huge shift out there and the physicality was intense but I’m glad we got over the line,” Head Coach Briony Akle said.

“The team ultimately got it done and I’m very proud of their professionalism.”

With Maddy Turner ruled out of the opening rounds, a huge amount of responsibility fell on the shoulders of replacement Lauren Moore and she didn’t disappoint, putting in an MVP performance.

“Lozzie has had so many injury problems the past few years but she has been in the Swifts environment since 2016 and now we are really starting to see her ability come to fruition. That was a hell of a fight to be thrown into today and she made the court her own.”

Despite registering the first score off turnover possession with a beautiful Sam Wallace layup, the Giants settled faster than the Swifts and good defensive pressure was causing confusion in the Premiers’ attacking third.

However just before the first Rebel Power Five of the game the Premiers harried and got back within two goals. Both Wallace and Helen Housby were unsuccessful with their first Super Shot attempts but soon started to hit the target. NSW junior, Nicole Styles, also made her club debut in GD. The teams went to the first break tied at 17 goals apiece.

The second quarter was a scrappy affair with both teams lacking fluidity but when the Super Shot period hit, Harten was proving difficult to handle from distance.

The speed and physicality upped in the second half and the Giants were doing enough to keep the Swifts at bay before defensive pressure and excellent use of the Super Shot gave Wallace the opportunity to put the Premiers in the driving seat. In the space of five minutes the Swifts went from five goals down to leading by three at the final break, taking the quarter by 21 goals to 13.

They put their foot on the gas for most of the fourth quarter, and saw it out to secure the win and retain the Carole Sykes Memorial Trophy until the next time the sides meet later in the season.



Proud recovered and ready to lead Swifts' 2020 charge

She may have had to lead the NSW Swifts from the sidelines for the second half of 2019's Premiership-winning campaign, but Maddy Proud is back and raring for the 2020 Suncorp Super Netball season.

The 26-year-old, who ruptured an ACL in the Swifts' Round 7 win over the Queensland Firebirds in Brisbane last year, will reprise the role of club captain in 2020 and she is determined to pick up where she left off.

After a long preseason of recovery and training, Proud finally returned to court last week in the side's Round 1 win against the GIANTS.

"The Covid-19 lockdown and season delay has been very trying on everyone but for me that cloud actually had a silver lining," Proud says.

"When the season was originally due to start in early May I was really racing to be fit but the extra time off has allowed me to get my knee fully right.

"It's been a year since I have hit the court in a competitive game but the support I've had from everyone at the Swifts - on the court, off the court and in the stands - has been wonderful.

"I'm also delighted to have Paige Hadley and

Maddy Turner with me in the leadership team again. Paige was brilliant leading on the court last year, especially in the Grand Final, as was Maddy, so having them by my side again is a huge boost.

Australian Diamond Hadley will continue as club vice-captain in 2020 while fellow Aussie international Turner reprises her role in the leadership team.

Head coach Briony Akle said she is looking forward to what this leadership team can do in 2020.

"This group led the Swifts to a sixth Premiership last year but it was the first in a while," Akle said.

"Our team is hungry and I know our leadership team has what it takes to drive the group forward.

"Each of them will have their own individual targets, but they will also be looking out for the collective and that's vital - they need to push everyone else as hard as they push themselves.

"Good teams win a Premiership but great teams win multiple. That's the goal and these are the leaders who can take us in the direction we need to go." ●




